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## **Drop-Off and Pick -Up Updates and Tips**

Some things to consider.

Thank you to all the parents who are adhering to the traffic and management plan that was a plain jointly created by New Horizons School, Strathcona County Traffic Safety, Strathcona County Traffic Enforcement, and Elk Island Transportation.

Now that we are into October, we are getting a good picture of traffic flow and parking.

We hope you adhere to the following information below so that during peak hours, student drop of and pick-up can be done safely and smoothly.

## **Morning Drop Off**

The 30 Second Drop-Off zone is for morning drop-off. The 30 second time limit is enforceable.


Please note where the drop-off zone begins and end. Beyond the dropoff zone is a **No Stopping-No Parking** zone. This zone is enforceable as well.

### Before the Morning Buses Arrive

If you arrive in the morning before 8:35 a.m., feel free to enter the parking lot and drop your child off at the front door if the buses are not there.

You may drive up to the curb and use the **school bus zone** as a 30 second drop off zone.

You may also park in the parking stalls and escort your child into the school. However, should you be parked when the buses arrive, you will be unable to exit the lot until the buses leave.



### When the Buses Arrive

When the buses arrive, usually not before 8:25 a.m., the parking lot will be closed to traffic entering and exiting the parking lot.

Supervision will move to the drop off zone on the street until the buses leave.

When the buses leave, usually before 8:35 a.m., the parking lot will reopen.

There will be no supervision after the buses leave.

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## After School Pick Up

### The Street Pick-Up Zone

Please follow the traffic flow arrows (blue arrows) to lessen the amount of congestion on the street.


After school, the 30 second Drop Off Zone (blue) becomes a **pick-up zone**. You may wait here beyond 30 seconds, **but you must remain in your vehicle**.

Leaving your vehicle slows the traffic flow when others in front of you have already left the zone. As well, please be aware that the zone is enforceable. If you leave your vehicle, you may be ticketed should traffic enforcement be in the area.

Beyond the drop-off zone is a **No Stopping-No Parking Zone** (red) . This zone is also enforceable. Do not stop to pick up your children here.

### Before the Buses Depart

- Please do not block the driveways of our neighbours.
- A supervisor is assigned to hold students at this spot.
- Another supervisor will be on the sidewalk escorting or monitoring students as they enter vehicles. Even if you are parked several cars behind the front of the line, your child will be escorted to your vehicle.
- When you and your children are safely secured, leave the line.
- If a vehicle in front of you leaves the line, please advance to keep the line moving forward.
- It is important to have a conversation with your child about after school pickup. Remind him or her to get organized quickly and to not play in the playground (he or she should wait at the sidewalk).



### After the Buses Depart

- When the buses depart, a supervisor will remain at the 30 Second Drop Off Zone until all vehicles have left.
- After that time there will be no supervision.
- Parents are invited to park in the parking lot after the buses have left.
- Students who have not been picked up by 3:30 will be asked to remain near Entrance #2.

### If You Are In The Parking Lot While the Buses Are Loading

If you have parked in the parking lot before the buses arrive, you will be required to remain in the parking lot until the buses depart.

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
