Recent Board Initiatives



Vice Principal: The establishment of the new position of Vice Principal, with a start date of January 1, 2016. A part-time teacher will be hired to provide administrative relief time for the VP.

Project Based Learning: Allocation of \$8,325 to support successful Year 1 implementation (training and support) of a Project-based Learning initiative.

Teachers of Gifted Learners: Allocation of \$6,500 towards focused professional development for teachers of gifted learners. This includes funds to support new teacher mentorship, membership for each teacher with the National Association for Gifted Children (access to periodicals/videos, etc.), and an honorarium for completion of U of C courses specific to gifted education

Marketing: Funding of up to \$15,000 to be used in marketing materials and design to support our goal of continued enrolment growth.

Budget Update

The NHCS anticipates total revenues for the 2015/16 school year at \$2.62 million and total expenses at \$2.70 million, with a resulting operating deficit for the current year of \$80,000. Although the recent board initiative items contributed to a deficit larger than that which we would typically approve, the Board unanimously voted in favour of taking action to enhance the learning environment for our gifted children and to invite others to join us. Further, the deficit is supported by an accumulated operating reserve in excess of \$500,000

Sherwood Park Regional Planning Exercise

The Sherwood Park Regional Planning Exercise is designed generally to address the school facility needs of the four public school jurisdictions that serve Sherwood Park: New Horizons Charter School Society, Elk Island Public Schools, Elk Island Catholic Schools, Conseil scolaire Centre-Nord. In addition, its specific purpose is to identify a permanent school location for the recently-formed École francophone de Sherwood Park. The Board is grateful for the opportunity to engage in this process, is committed to participating in it, and remains optimistic that it will result in an outcome that addresses the learning needs in the students of our school, as well as those of the students in the other school jurisdictions.

A resident of the neighbourhood adjacent to the school recently provided us with a copy of a letter that was distributed to all homes in the community. In it the writers, identified as "Concerned Parents and Community Members of Sherwood Park," advise neighbourhood residents of the pending construction of the francophone starter school and list a series of perceived concerns with respect to its arrival. The Board wishes to advise parents that the preparation and circulation of this letter was not undertaken by the Board, the Board was not advised in advance of its distribution, and the Board is not supportive of it. Further, the Board is concerned about the extent to which letters of this nature may place our school in a negative light and diminish its reputation.

Thank you to all that attended the Education Ministry facilitated meeting on November 30th to discuss the proposed Francophone School. While not all our questions were answered at that time, the Board is committed to full participation in the Sherwood Park Regional Planning Exercise as a means of addressing student accommodation issues in our community.
