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Superintendent's Report to the Board of Directors

March 8, 2017

I. School Fees

During the Speech from the Throne on Thursday, March 2, 2017, the following comments were made with respect to the issue of school fees:

Every September, parents across Alberta scramble to cobble together money to pay for a host of school fees. Rather than having a bit extra to put into savings or groceries or their mortgage, parents are forced to redirect their money to pay for education services.

For years, families have said enough is enough, the fees are too much. And yet, school fees have grown and grown.

This session, your government will take a major step forward to make life more affordable for parents and families by eliminating instructional supply and material fees at Alberta's public schools.

Your government will also eliminate busing fees for children travelling to their designated school. The first bill tabled this session will start that work, by eliminating these fee categories in time for the start of the next school year.

These changes will reduce total mandatory school fees by approximately 25 per cent. Work to further reduce school fees for families will continue.

During a meeting of Edmonton-area superintendents on the morning of Friday, March 3, which included a teleconference with Deputy Minister Curtis Clarke, it quickly became apparent that charter schools were not to be included in the school fees initiative.

Attached to this report is a letter (undated) from Education Minister Eggen that has been sent to superintendents of public, separate and francophone school jurisdictions – but not to charter school superintendents – with a request that it be forwarded to parents. The Board may wish to take note of the following statement in the letter:

... these fee reductions will come into effect this fall and no Alberta family will be required to pay for instructional supplies or materials, or for certain types of student transportation ...

The Association of Alberta Public Charter Schools is aware of this issue and is in the process of determining whether or not to respond. The Board may wish to consider this matter as well, with a view toward developing a possible response.

2. Education for Reconciliation

The following information was recently provided to school superintendents by Education Minister Eggen and Deputy Minister Clarke. It is presented here, not only for the information of the Board, but also to draw attention to an important issue which all schools are expected to address.

"We want the First Nation, Métis and Inuit people of Alberta to know that we deeply regret the profound harm and damage that occurred to generations of children forced to attend residential schools. While the Province of Alberta did not establish the system, members of the government did not take a stand to stop it. For this silence, we apologize." — Rachel Notley, Premier

Alberta Education has committed to supporting the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Call to Action to educate all students about the hidden truth of residential schools. As Premier Rachel Notley stated in her formal apology to residential school survivors: "These schools broke the connection between child and family... between community, language and culture. These children too often lost the ability to connect again with their families... losing their identity and the confidence to pass on their traditions to their own children."

We all have a role to play in reconciliation. Education for Reconciliation holds the promise of a fundamental shift in the thinking, attitudes and inter-cultural understanding to create societal change. It is a process brought to action by the collective efforts of all Canadians, by learning and working together to bring light to the history and significance of residential schools and treaties. The process will include First Nations, Métis and Inuit perspectives, experiences and ways of knowing, in historical and contemporary contexts, through Kindergarten to Grade 12 curriculum. Addressing this knowledge gap and rebalancing the education of Alberta students by enhancing current and future programs of study, is at the heart of Education for Reconciliation.

To accomplish this work, curriculum development Expert Working Groups were formed, comprised of certificated teachers, nominated by Superintendents and Education Directors, with subject expertise. These experts include First Nations and Métis teachers. In addition, representatives for the Northwest Territories and Nunavut are also included and share the perspectives of the North and Inuit.

Education stakeholders are also collaborating to ensure teachers have the tools and support they need to advance First Nations, Métis and Inuit history and perspectives in the classroom. This systemic approach and enhancements to curriculum and professional development will serve to enrich the knowledge and understanding of current and future generations of Albertans.

We are on the cusp of a fundamental shift in education. The First Nations, Métis and Inuit Education Division is excited for the opportunities ahead as we move forward to ensure students are at the heart of curriculum development and that all students are nurtured and supported, and see themselves in the learning that they do every day, while closing the achievement gap.

3. Modernization Update

At the time of writing, Phase I of our school modernization project was scheduled for completion on March 5, 2016, with the move into the new or newly-modernized spaces slated to occur on March 6 and 7. Although some work remains to be done (e.g. replacement of main electrical panel, installation of new whiteboards) in the Phase I area, the following spaces will be turned over to the school on March 6:

- Six new modular classrooms for the grade 1, 2, 3, and 3/4 classes, including two breakout areas associated with these classes.
- Student Gathering Area (opposite Learning Commons). This room will likely be purposed as a classroom following completion of the modernization project.
- Music classroom
- Conference room
- Sensory room
- Change rooms
- Recording studio
- Several storage rooms
- Offices for counsellor, resource teacher, secretary-treasurer, superintendent

During Phase 2, scheduled for the period March 6 to April 14, the following areas will be modernized:

- Learning Commons
- Three classrooms adjacent to the Learning Commons
- Staffroom and staff washrooms
- Student washrooms in east corridor

The Learning Commons will be temporarily relocated to the new Student Gathering Area, and the three classes presently located adjacent to the Learning Commons, as well as the staffroom, will be relocated to the east wing of portable classrooms.

Dear Parents and Guardians,

I am pleased to share with you some information about Bill 1: An Act to Reduce School Fees, which our government recently introduced in the legislature. By introducing this legislation, our government is working to make life better and more affordable for Alberta families.

If Bill 1 is passed, these fee reductions will come in to effect this fall and no Alberta family will be required to pay for instructional supplies or materials, or for certain types of student transportation, as outlined below. These two school fees represent approximately 25 per cent of the fees collected each year by school boards, and reducing them would lead to Alberta families saving more than \$50 million annually.

Instructional supplies or materials include fees for textbooks, workbooks, printing and paper costs incurred by their public schools. It also includes any common fees that are charged to an entire student body, or grade cohort. These fees can be referred to as—among other titles—instructional fees, instructional materials or basic fees. To date, school fees have varied significantly from school to school, so your savings will depend on the type and amount of fees currently charged by your child's school.

Bill 1, if passed, will also remove bus fees for eligible students traveling to their designated school. That means that if your child attends his or her designated school and that school is more than 2.4 kilometres away from your home, you will not be charged transportation fees. In some circumstances—for example, if parents choose to enrol their child in a school other than their designated school—fees may still be incurred.

Our government understands that times are tough for Alberta families and is working to make education more affordable. We believe that all students deserve access to a quality education in an Alberta school, and we are committed to reducing financial barriers such as school fees.

Subject: Proposed School Calendar for 2017-18

Background:

The attached proposed school calendar for 2017-18 was presented to the Board of Directors at the its meeting of February 15, 2017. At that time, the Board approved the following resolution:

Motion to approve the 2017-18 school calendar in principle, to circulate the calendar to school staff and the School Council for feedback, and to present the calendar, with feedback to the Board at its March 2017 meeting.

Moved: Director Panas, Seconded: Director Macdonald, Carried

In accordance with this resolution, the proposed calendar was referred to the school staff and School Council, with the following feedback having been received:

- 1. School Council: The School Council expressed a wish to avoid the "no bus" day scheduled for October 5 in the draft calendar. (October 5 is a Professional Development Day in Elk Island Public Schools and therefore buses will not be operating on that date.) The School Council was advised that the reason for scheduling instruction for October 5 was to enable the staff to attend the Charter Schools Conference schedule for October 27. (In past years, very few members of staff have been able to attend the Charter Schools Conference because it has usually been held in Calgary and has not been held on day scheduled for professional development in the New Horizons' calendar. The upcoming conference will be held in Edmonton; hence the scheduling of a PD Day on October 27 in the draft calendar.)
- 2. School Staff: Three responses from staff members were received. All drew attention to the "in lieu" day scheduled on November 10, expressing a preference for the "in lieu" day to be scheduled on December 22 instead, the rationale being that November 10 would be a more productive day for instruction than December 22. Implementation of such a change would mean that November 10 would be an instructional day with no bus service, in that schools will be closed in Elk Island Public Schools on that date.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that, giving consideration to the feedback received with respect to the proposed school calendar, the Board adopt the school calendar for 2017-18, in either its present or amended form.

Subject: Three-Year Capital Plan 2018-21

Background:

Each year, Alberta school boards are required to assess their school capital needs and to prioritize proposed projects - new and replacement schools, modernizations, and additions - based on the safety of existing school facilities, enrolment pressures, modernization needs etc. The resulting three-year capital plans are to be submitted to Alberta Education by April 1 of each year. Alberta Education then examines the plan for each school jurisdiction and identifies the most pressing needs by considering school board priorities and other criteria. Funding for capital projects is awarded in accordance with Alberta Education decisions and available funds.

Alberta Education has advised that, in light of the major modernization that is presently underway at our school, scheduled for completion during the 2017-18 school year, and accepting that there are no other capital priorities at our school at the present time (i.e. priorities that would call for a replacement school, modernization, or addition), it is not necessary for New Horizons School to submit a capital plan this year.

Requests for modular classroom units are submitted in early November of each year through the "Modular Submission Process." Should our school wish to submit a request for additional modular classrooms in order to accommodate enrolment growth, it will have opportunity do so at that time.

Recommendations:

It is recommended that the Board advise Alberta Education that it will not be submitting Three-Year Capital Plan this year.
